Are these cheers for the RG Falcons or the Amelia Raiders? It's both! Back in the day, Ronald Johnson' 65 and Kermit Wilkerson '68 were star players for the Falcons. Their families roots in the Russell Grove tradition date back to the '40s. The athletic skill set has been passed on to their brothers, Mark and Glen. After playing many outstanding football seasons for ACHS themselves, these young men continue to spur Amelia athletes onto victory.

This year's Amelia County High School football and basketball teams exploded with an unprecedented winning season. The Raiders football team won the district, regional and sectional championships. 

Mark Johnson '87 loves this football team. As the previous coach, he began working with the team as freshmen.
